
Dear Resident

WHY HAVE I RECEIVED THIS SURVEY?

A significant challenge for Rural Housing across the Southeast of England is providing affordable housing for those in need in the local community.

Through this survey we wish to find out more about current levels of affordable housing need in Example for people with a local connection to the parish- for example through residence or employment.

When homes come on the market in Example, prices can be high, as can costs for private rented properties. Since January 2023, 7 properties have been sold in Example at an average price of £582,100 (SOURCE rightmove.co.uk). This means that houses cost over 12 times the average salary of £40,939 in the district of Borough County. (SOURCE: Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings, 2023).



The survey has been commissioned by Example Village Parish Council and is being undertaken by Connecting Communities in Berkshire (CCB). All information given will be kept by CCB in accordance with General Data Protection Regulations 2018 and will not be shared with any other organisation including the Parish Council. WHAT DO WE MEAN BY AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEED?

People in need might include:

- First-time buyers
- Older people thinking about down-sizing
- People struggling to afford rent or mortgage costs
- People who cannot afford to buy a home at open-market prices
- People who need housing at an affordable rent

We would like to have the views of everyone on this issue. All households are asked to complete Part 1, even if they are not in housing need.

Part 2 should be filled in by those households which have a housing need now or expect to have one in the next five years.

What is it affordable housing?

People sometimes talk about needing affordable housing when they mean cheaper open-market housing. However, the term affordable housing has a specific meaning when it comes to government policy. Affordable housing is defined in the government's National Planning Policy Framework. Social or affordable rent, shared ownership, First Homes, and discounted market sales housing are all types of affordable housing.

National Planning Policy Framework (publishing.service.gov.uk)

How much does it cost?

Social rent is around 50% of market rent, affordable rental homes are at least 20% cheaper than the average rent for private rented accommodation. Shared ownership is more affordable than buying a home on the open market – you buy a proportion of the dwelling, usually from a local authority or housing association, and rent the rest. First Homes are at least 30% cheaper than average sale price of property and can only be sold to first-time buyers.

MORE INFORMATION ABOUT AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND LOCAL CONNECTIONS

To be eligible for affordable housing through a Housing Association you must be registered on the Borough County Housing Register. You can find information and apply at: www.localauthoritywebsite

What does 'local connection' mean?

Establishment of what constitutes local connection will be agreed with the Borough. It will usually include current residence, former residence (for example growing up in the parish), employment in the parish or the need to be nearer to close family members.
